HAPPY SECOND BIRTHDAY!!



I hope that everyone is still enjoying receiving the Cheney Chatter and finds it useful. Do let us know if there is anything you would like to see included, either once or on a regular basis.

Following January's snow falls which lasted longer than most people wished, the Parish Council would like to know what sort of problems you encountered and how you feel we could help. We can then build up a key strategy and hopefully be better prepared next time.

We are particularly interested in anyone who lives in the village and owns a 4 x 4 which they would be happy to use to help in such a situation. Obviously, these vehicles would not be used without your consent and you would be the driver. We just need a list of names and phone numbers of people we could call upon to help out.

Anyone with a particular skill which could be useful if the village were cut off is also asked to come forward and register with the Council. We need people willing to help in a crisis, such as medical help, driving skills, digging out, chain saws, collecting and delivering prescriptions, collecting shopping from the local shops, checking on neighbours etc.

All your details and information would be held in confidence in the Parish offices and would only be used by the clerk and the emergency planning committee when

necessary.

I would like to thank all our responsible dog owners for picking up after their pets. However, there are still too many careless dog owners in the village and it seems that the snow was covering up a lot of problems. Now that it has gone our village is being covered by something a lot worse. It is not difficult to "grab it, bag it and bin it" and this is in fact the law. If caught, the fixed penalty cost is £75 and can go up to £1,000 in some cases. At the moment it costs the Parish Council about £ 10,000 a year to empty dog bins and collect litter.

The Parish Council will be putting up several extra bins in the Spring and there will be a map on the website and the notice boards asking for suggestions for suitable sites. Please let me know where you would like them. Let us try and keep our village as clean and litter free as possible.

FIRST RESPONDERS – Volunteers are required for a new project. We are setting up a Community First Responders team to work with the Ambulance service in Middleton Cheney.



First Responders are members of the general public who live locally and in most cases have no medical training. This is how it works. The responder on duty would be contacted by the emergency services and dispatched to the casualty. Being local they can attend quickly and give emergency help with cardiac arrest, chest pains, breathing difficulties, choking, epileptic seizures, diabetic emergencies and

unconscious casualties. An ambulance would always be dispatched to the casualty.

All the on-going costs, training, mobile phones, oxygen cylinders etc would be supplied and the cost covered by East Midlands Ambulance Service. The Parish Council would have to buy a defibrillator. This service has been tried in other parts of the country and been shown to save lives. The EMA would also undertake the enhanced CRB check for each volunteer.

Volunteers must be over 18 (able to drive) have their own transport, either car or motor bike, and willing to be on call within the village for perhaps one 24hr period a month. Of course the more people we have the less time you would be on duty. Please give your name and contact details to the clerk either by email or letter at the Parish Meeting Rooms. This really is a worthwhile project and saves lives.

VACANCY FOR YOUTH WORKER - Middleton Cheney Parish Council are looking for a locally based youth worker. The position is paid and is initially for a 3 month contract (with a further 6 months by arrangement).

You will be heading up a team of volunteers to set up and run our new youth club whilst developing new opportunities for our young people. This may well involve securing further funding – knowledge of the funding system would be advantageous. You will also be required to carry out some detached work within the village. Hours are negotiable from 4 to 6 hours per week but will include some Saturday evenings.

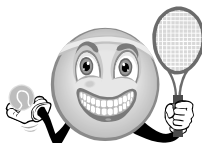

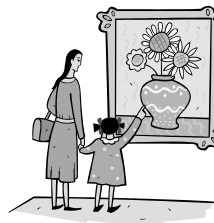

A report by our intrepid village explorer - Jane Bullock



I DID IT...! - and lived to tell the tale. The Sinai Desert Trek was awesome in every respect but I have to say that I have 'gone off' sand in a big way and if anyone had told me what I would be doing I might not have gone!!!

We walked for miles and miles on deep, soft beach type sand; climbed many steep dunes; scrambled up many rock faces and then, promptly, climbed down again from as high as 700ft; picked our way through shaley, stony wadis [dry river beds]; climbed up rocky gorges strewn with boulders and picked our way through the Coloured Canyon where the gap between rock faces was sometimes only wide enough for one foot at a time. We slid under, climbed over and round boulders of varying sizes at many different levels and generally saw the terrain from every angle!!

We slept in Bedouin tents, which are rather like draughty bus shelters without fronts [men and women all together] and watched shooting stars in cloudless skies in absolute silence, unless someone was snoring of course!!



The food was a mix of Bedouin and Egyptian and was very good although none of us knew what to make of the spaghetti soup that appeared for breakfast one day! The Bedouin made bread fresh for each breakfast and supper on open fires which was just wonderful.

Our leaders and support team were magnificent, unobtrusive but always there to give us confidence. We also had an armed policeman with us 24/7 and three security guards with machine guns!! Well, we were in complete wilderness for five days and when the occasional Bedouin appeared 'out of the ether' and merged back into it you realised that if anyone wished us ill they could easily have done it.

I have been quite overwhelmed by everyone's generosity. The final Fund total for the South Northants Side-by-Side project will be very close, if not at, £8,000 for which I thank you most sincerely. This is before Gift Aid is recovered. It will be well used to help people with Dementia and their carers locally.

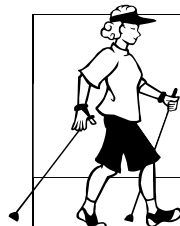

MIDDLETON CHENEY HEALTH WALKS - Largely as a result of the enthusiasm of our founding walk leaders, Angela & Roy Clements, the village walks continue to go from strength to strength, with over 150 participants signed onto the local scheme. These walks are part of the South Northants 'Walking for Health' programme.



The various length walks are intended to improve stamina and lead to better health. All are of a social nature and refreshments are available afterwards if required. The different grades of walk are held on the following days of each month:-
