



THE STORIES BEHIND THE STONES – CEMETERY RECORDING PROJECT

Following the success of the All Saint's Churchyard memorial inscription recording and the published booklet in 2010; members of the village history society have been spotted recording all the headstones in Middleton Cheney cemetery this summer.

The consecration of the cemetery by the Bishop of Leicester took place on the 24th June 1925 and the first burials took place in July of that year.

The project has revealed a number of fascinating stories behind the stones including a nurse who was killed in a Birmingham air-raid during World War Two, a sculptor and photographer with his long-term friend who was a famous actress, a soldier who died in a Japanese prisoner-of-war camp and the village headmaster who was in charge of the primary school for forty-four years.



We are hoping that the information will help people who are tracing their ancestry – both families who still live in Middleton and those from further a-field. Our grateful thanks go to Alison Coomber for entering all the information on the Parish Council database.
