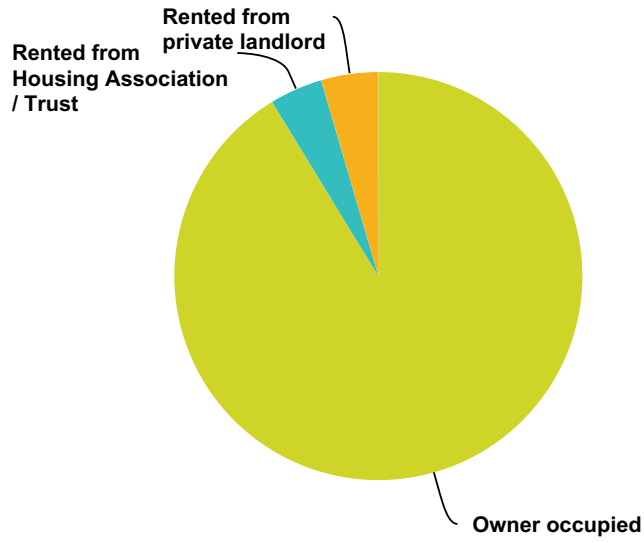

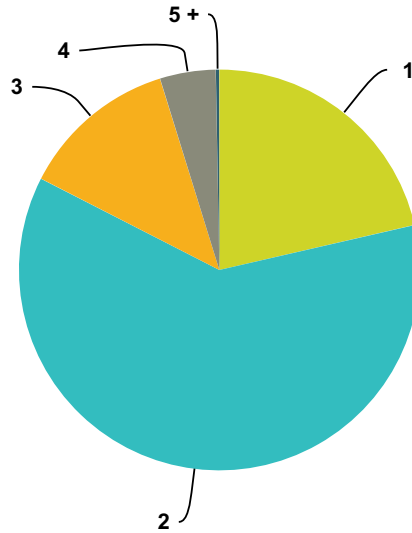

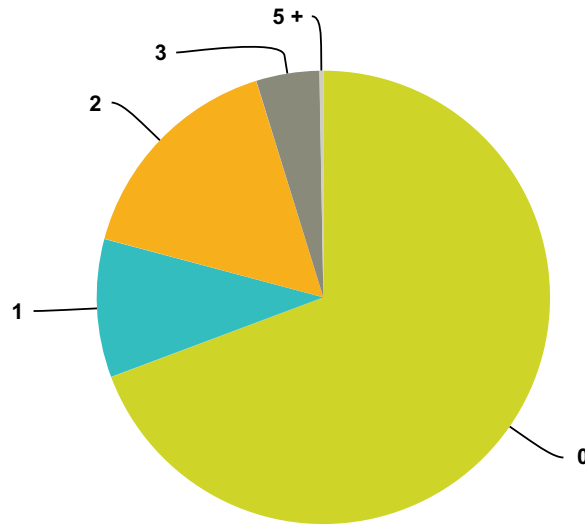

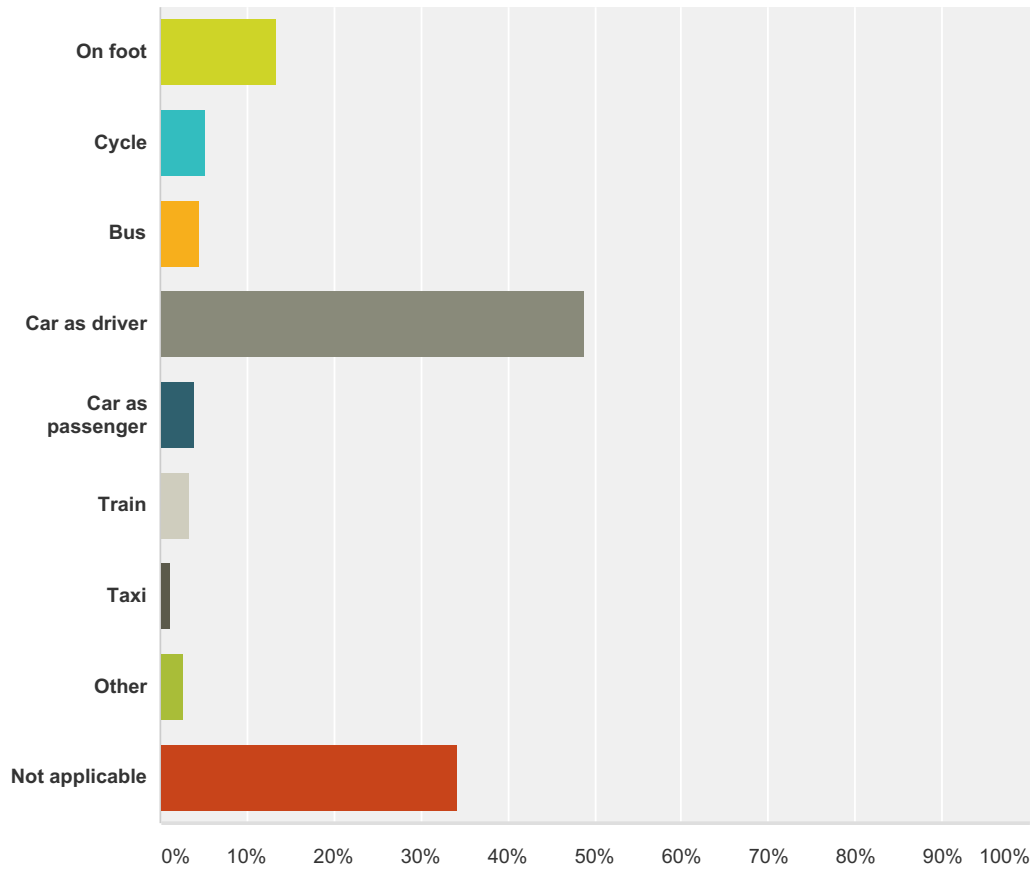

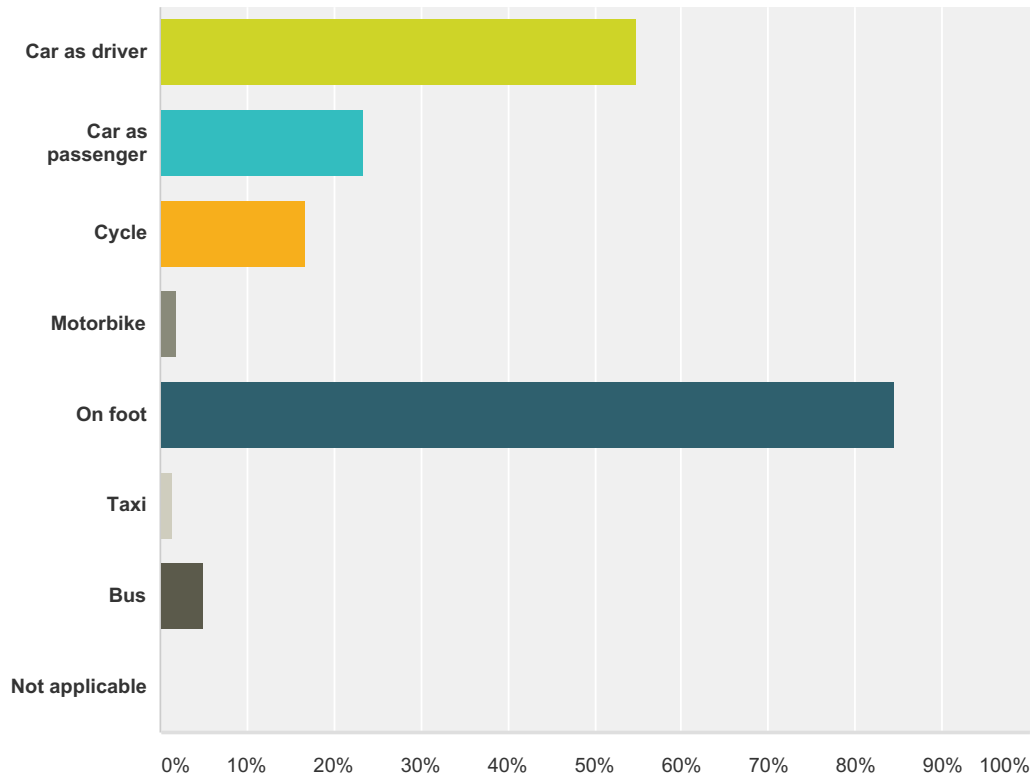

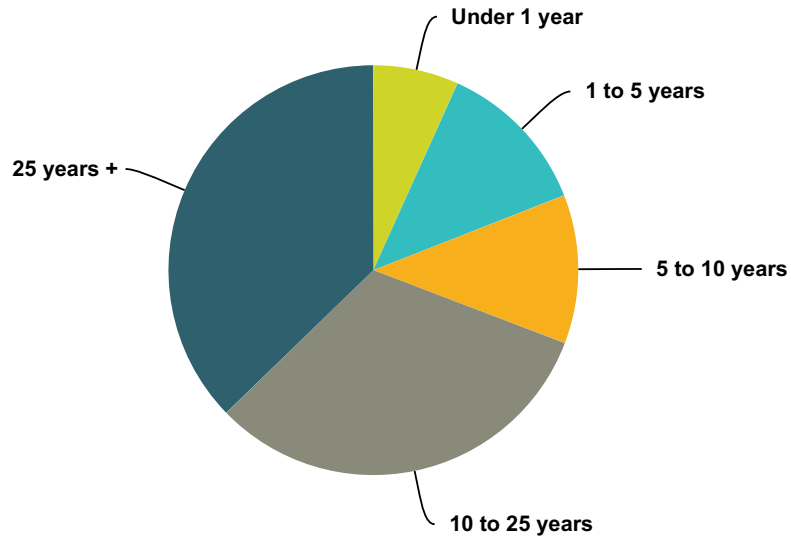

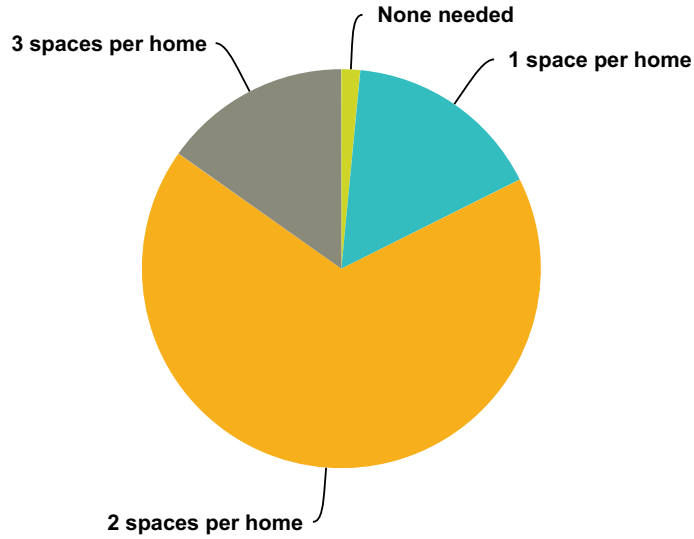

Q21 D1. Over the next 20 years to 2034, do you think that there will be the need for more places of employment locally?

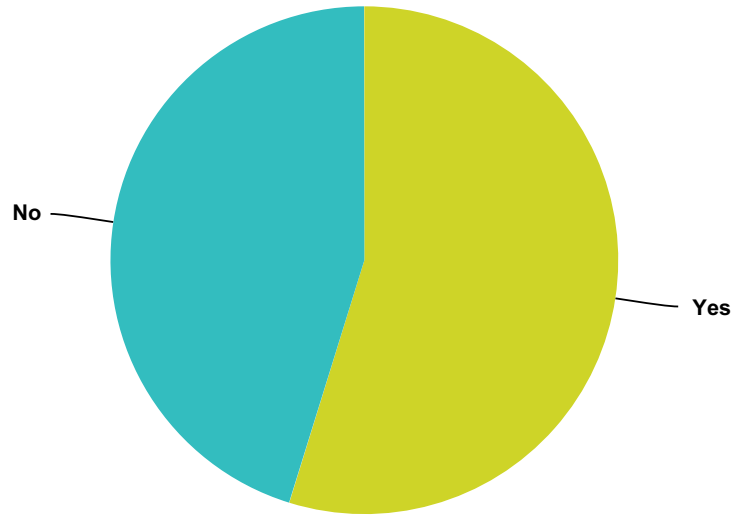

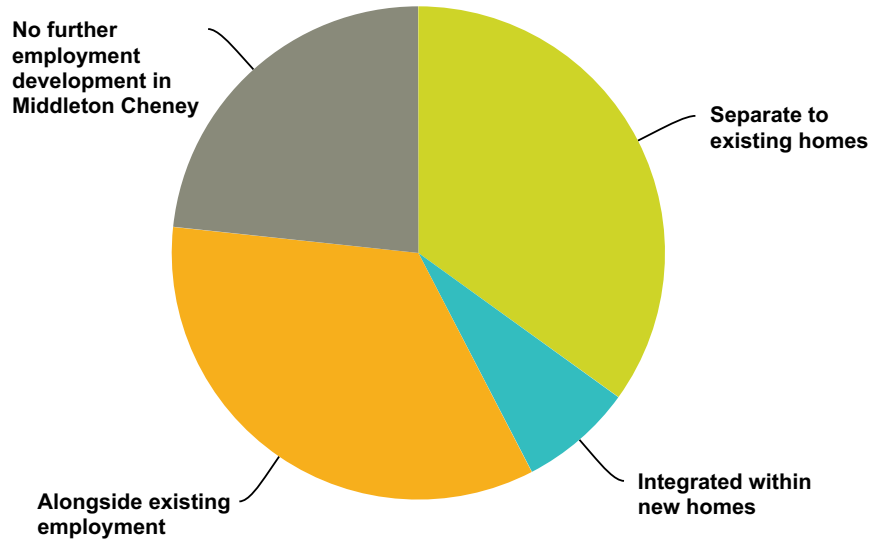

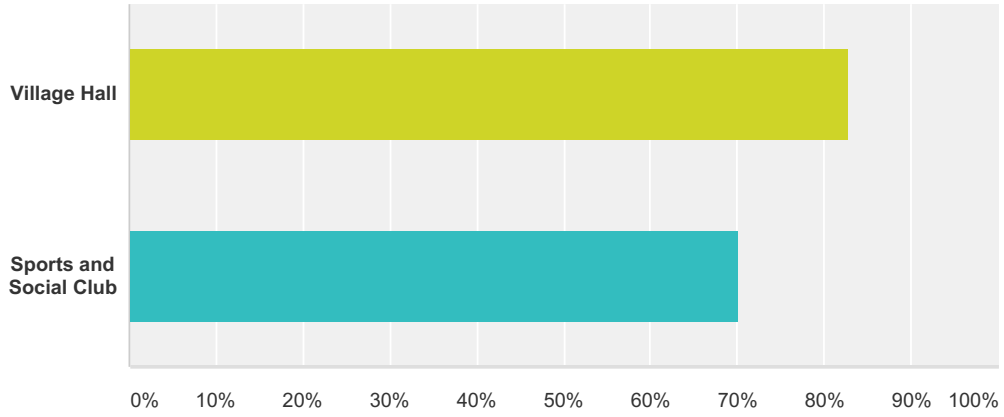

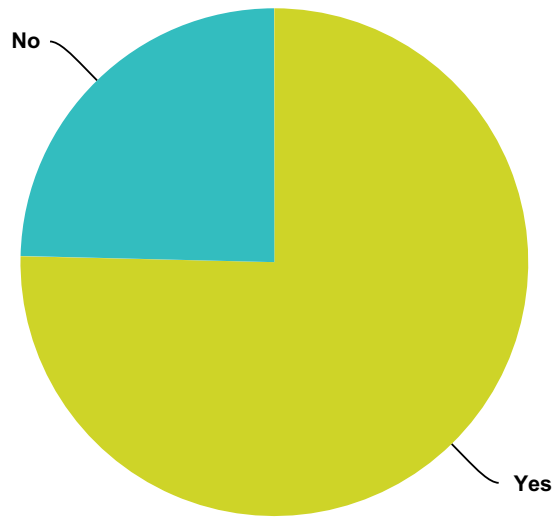

Q28 E4. Would you like a new community centre combining a number of functions?

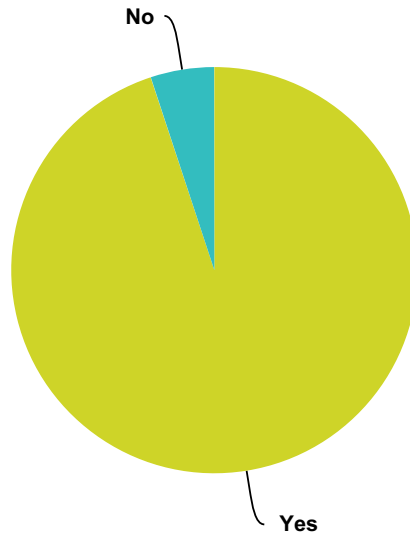

Q29 E5. Do you use the footpaths in the village?

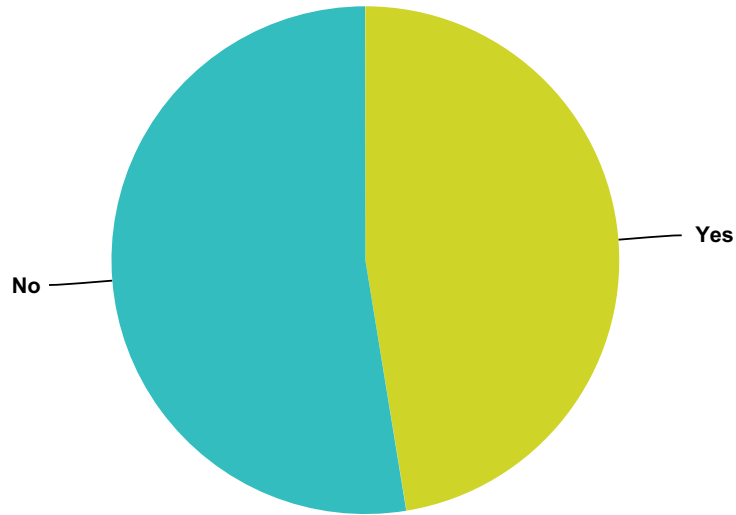

Q30 E6. Do we need cycle lanes in the village?

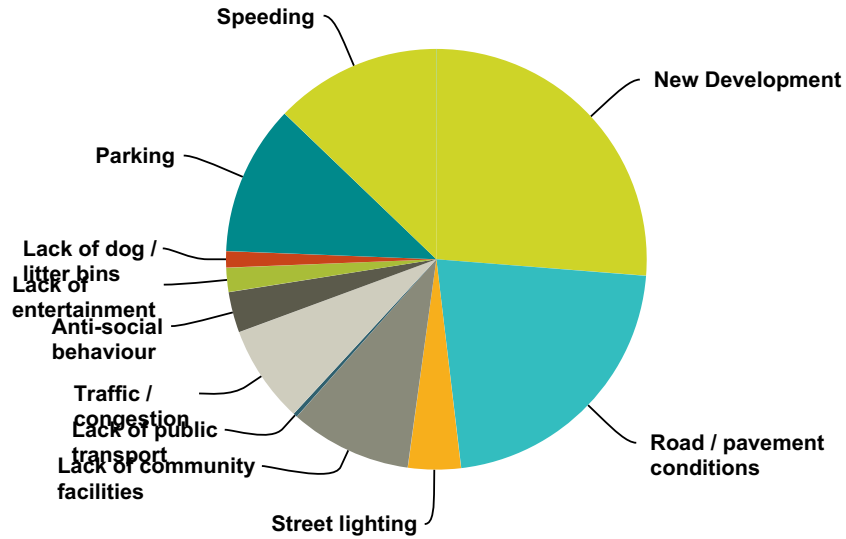
